



Lincoln County 4-H Ambassador Contract



Being a Lincoln County 4-H Ambassador is both an honor and a privilege. You are not only the face of Lincoln County 4-H but you are leaders. Each member of the 4-H Ambassador is an asset to the program. When a member is habitually missing from meetings it creates difficulty to the others to plan effectively. To make sure that each Ambassador contributes to the program this contract was developed by the 4-H Ambassadors and approved by the Lincoln County 4-H Leaders Association Board of Directors. The ambassadors agreed to have three evaluations with the Board of Directors to determine the fulfillment of the following terms:

- Attend a minimum of ½ of the Ambassador meetings.
- Follow through on activities that they agree to attend.
- Participate to their fullest ability.

The consequences for not complying to these terms are as follows:

- 1st Phase
 - Verbal warning
 - Ambassador must send a note of apology and verbally apologize to other 4-H ambassadors
- 2nd Phase
 - Come before the board of directors to explain lack of participation.
- 3rd Phase
 - No longer able to participate as an ambassador for the rest of the year.
 - Must interview to become an ambassador in future years.
- Non compliance of any consequences not completed by the end of the next time period.
 - No longer able to participate as an ambassador for the rest of the year.
 - Must interview to become an ambassador in future years.

Evaluations will be held as follows:
